





CULTURAL EQUITY ENDOWMENT FUND



SEC. 68.1. PURPOSES

The Cultural Equity Endowment Fund is established to move San Francisco arts funding toward cultural equity.

The Arts Commission seeks to fund artists and organizations that foster artistic expression deeply rooted in and reflective of historically marginalized communities, including for example those communities highlighted by the Cultural Equity Endowment Legislation and the Grantmakers in the Arts' "Racial Equity in Arts Funding: Statement of Purpose and Recommendations for Action," and the Cultural Equity Endowment Fund.

Organization Information

ELIGIBILITY

- Eligibility begins on page 4 of the Guidelines.
- Cannot apply in any category with a current open grant.
- Proof of minimum 2-year San Francisco residency.

Eligibility – Who Can Apply

If you have questions about your eligibility, please email <u>sfac.grants@sfgov.org</u> before you apply.

All Applicants

If you are a current San Francisco Arts Commission grantee, you are not eligible to apply for a category that is the same as your open grant. You must close out your current grant completely, with an approved final report and final payment, and your grant term must expire, before you are eligible for that category. If you have questions about eligibility, please contact your Program Officer.

All Applicants Must:

• Provide proof of a physical San Francisco address that is not a P.O. box or commercial mailbox service:

ELIGIBILITY

- ALL Applicants must:
 - Have a two-year demonstrated history of operating/living in San Francisco.
 - Artists and Organizations must highlight historically marginalized communities such as those listed in the Cultural Equity Endowment legislation.
 - Project activities must take place in S.F. between a defined grant window (depending on grant).
 - Be willing and able to meet the requirements associated with receiving funds from the City and County of San Francisco.

ELIGIBILITY - ARTISTS

Artist Applicants Must:

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Have a fiscal sponsor IF they are:
 - Working with minors under 18 years old.
 - Working with seniors over 65 years old.
 - Working with people with disabilities.
 - Were employed by the City & County in the past, including the San Francisco Unified School District and San Francisco City College.
- Artist Applicants may be Sole Proprietors or LLCs with a budget cap of \$500,000.

Artist Applicants Must NOT:

- Be a full-time student.
- Be a City employee.
- Apply on behalf of an organization.

ELIGIBILITY - ORGANIZATIONS

Organization Applicants Must:

- Be a 501c3 filling a 990PC or Fiscally Sponsored by a San Francisco 501c3 in good standing with the IRS, CA Franchise Tax Board, CA Attorney General, CA Secretary of State.
- Have a budget cap \$2M.
- Provide 2 years of Profit and Loss statements.
- Upload most recent 990.
- Mission focused on arts and or youth art activities in SF.

Organization Applicants Must NOT:

- Be a 501c3 private foundation filing a 990PF or be a for profit entity.
 - LLCs with a budget cap of \$500,000 and sole proprietorships may apply with a fiscal sponsor.
- Be a part of another City agency or Department this includes Cultural Centers and Cultural Districts.
- Be a Community Benefit District.



ELIGIBILITY - FISCAL SPONSORS

Fiscal Sponsors must:

- Be in compliance with the IRS, CA Franchise Tax Board, CA Attorney General, CA Secretary of State.
- Provide proof of Agreement or Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the fiscal sponsor and the fiscally sponsored applicant that:
 - Define the fiscal sponsor model.
 - Describes services provide by fiscal sponsor.
 - Describes how funds are disbursed.
 - Outlines the reporting requirements.
 - Includes the fiscal sponsorship fee.
 - Identifies the fiscal sponsor's staff person who will serve as the primary liaison with the fiscally-sponsored project/entity.
- Maintain adequate fiscal staff and systems to support the sponsored program.
- Provide Profit and Loss Statements and Balance sheets for sponsored project.

ELIGIBILITY - FISCAL SPONSORS

- Hold operating reserves sufficient to support the sponsored program.
- Work with the subgrantee to complete and submit financial documentation of the disbursement of funds with the final report.
- Pay all funds to the subgrantee in advance of the final disbursement of the grant.
- Fiscally sponsored projects may include LLCs with a \$500,00 budget cap and Sole Proprietorships.

Fiscal Sponsors must NOT:

- Be fiscally sponsored themselves.
- Be engaged retroactively or changed after a grant application is submitted or approved for funding.
- Sponsor a for-profit entity or project.
- Act as a fiscal sponsor for employees or artists contracted by that organization; a third-party fiscal sponsor is required.

RESTRICTIONS

- Applicants may submit ONE application per grant category.
- NEW: One Grant Award Limit Per Applicant
 - In order to widely distribute funding, applicants will only be awarded ONE grant in this cycle. If an applicant submits to multiple grant categories and scores high enough to receive funding in more than one category, the grant will be awarded in the category that provides the most funding per fiscal year.
 - This means an individual or organization can apply with the same project for different grant categories, with the caveat that only one grant in one category will be awarded.
- Partners and collaborators cannot apply separately for the same project in any grant category.
- Grant funding does not imply that the San Francisco Arts Commission or any other City agency will produce, exhibit, promote or present the art created. It is the responsibility of the grantee to secure a venue, insurance and any permits for public presentations.

- Costs or expenses prohibited under the terms and conditions of any federal or state grant supplying all or any portion of the Grant Funds.
- Penalties, late charges or interest on any late payments.
- Taxes or other amounts withheld from wages or salaries which have not paid during the grant term or which relate to periods before or after the grant term.

- Grant Agreements are legal contracts.
- Insurance requirements vary, and are considered for every grant.

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APPLICATION REVIEW

Public Panels



- Unless otherwise stated, applications are reviewed by a public panel.
- Grant panelists are your peers.

Panel Review Framework

- Category scoring criteria
- May use the <u>Aesthetic Perspectives</u> <u>Framework</u> from Americans for the Arts.
- Panels are publicly accessible.
- Panel and Commission Influence Automatic Disqualification.

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• Panels are recorded.

ARTS IMPACT ENDOWMENT (AIE)



San Francisco Community 2021 San Francisco Artist (SFA) Grantee William Rhodes

AIE will support three broad funding channels, connected to a single theme of Keeping Artists in San Francisco:

- 1. Sustaining Ongoing Initiatives
- 2. Resilience & Growth
- 3. New Creative Opportunities

**Applicants <u>must select one funding channel</u> for their proposed project.*

- Up to \$50,000 for SF-based artists and up to \$100,000 SF based arts organizations
- Racial Equity and Social Justice lens for all program designs; public benefit accessible to San Francisco community.
- Grant Window is July 1, 2025 July 31, 2027 (25 month/2 years).
- Applications Due: Wednesday, November 13, 2024 at 12pm.

ARTISTIC LEGACY GRANT (ALG)

The Artistic Legacy Grant (ALG) acknowledges the impact of an artist who has been living and practicing their craft in San Francisco for the last 25 consecutive years or more.

- Eligibility Restrictions: Current ALG grantees and previous ALG Grant recipients are NOT eligible to apply.
- ALG funds may be used to support the artist's artistic legacy through professional development activities, salaries, artistic planning, artistic programs/events/projects, sabbaticals, artistic documentation, archiving of artistic work, or publications reflecting the history, legacy, and impact of the artist.
- Up to \$75,000 to one individual artist
- Grant window is July 1, 2025 to July 31, 2027
- Applications due Thursday, October 24, 2024 at 12 p.m.

CULTURAL EQUITY INITIATIVES (CEI)



Supports small and mid-sized arts organizations through multi-year core operating support grants to shift programming, build capacity and address recovery efforts.

- CEI grants may be used to fund general operating expenses such as salaries, rent, space planning, equipment and supplies
- Up to \$100,000 over two years. Grant window is July 1, 2025 to July 31, 2027
- Grant request amounts based on average annual operating revenue from two most recently completed fiscal years
- Organization Budget cap \$2.0 mil.
- Applications due Wednesday, October 30, 2024 at 12 p.m.

SAN FRANCISCO ARTISTS (SFA)

Supports artistic commissions that stimulate the creation and presentation of creative works of art presented throughout the city's neighborhoods.

- The artist must live in SF (for past two years), be at least 18 years old, and cannot be enrolled as a full-time student.
- Up to \$30,000 to San Francisco-based artists creating work.
- All genres; eighteen-month grant window.
- Public benefit accessible to an SF audience.
- Applications due Wednesday, November 6, 2024 at 12 p.m.

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SPECIAL PROJECT GRANTS



FY22SPX-AB21 Noe Valley Chamber Music Workshop with Danny Clay & Theresa Wong

Supports projects from other funding sources: Add-backs, Mayoral Enhancements, Department Work Orders.

- From \$50,000 \$350,000 for specific, project-based work.
- Eligibility is specific for each project description, read closely.
- No budget cap.
- No public panel.
- Applications due Wednesday, October 9, 2024 at 12 p.m.

GRANT SEEKER TIPS

- **Read the guidelines** thoroughly and refer to the instructions.
- Pay attention to the **scoring criteria**.
- Plan ahead:
 - Prepare you written responses in advance.
 - Gather work samples, team bios and other necessary documentation.
 - Research costs and prepare your budget.
 - Meet with the category Program Officer one-on-one.
 - Peer review! Have a trusted colleague read your application before you submit.

GRANT SEEKER TIPS



2020 Organizational Project Grant Manilatown Manang

- Draft responses in another document, then cut and paste answers into the online application form. Pay attention to word count.
- Upload **work samples** applicable to the artistic discipline that demonstrate the ability to complete the project.
- Write with **enthusiasm** and tell a compelling story.
- Be consistent, be specific, instill confidence in the panelists.
- Consider writing together and sharing in the process.
